0 Bookham Neighbourhood Panel

The committee welcomed the Police to the bi-monthly Neighbourhood Panel. There were a high number of domestics in November (mainly related to one address) and in December (mainly alcohol related).

PCSO Marion Hawkins reported on the break-ins at 63 Church Road which had been first flagged in July last year. A neighbour to 63 described some of the issues with this property. The PCSO had checked the property again today and it seemed secure. Cllr. Clare Curran had been made aware last September/October but there are very few derelict buildings across the district.

Road Safety Officer John Friar(??) then described his role as roadside education, vehicle checks, tax checks and identification of speeding drivers covering Mole Valley and four other boroughs. He also does Speed Watches for example with year 6 at Dawney School. This not only involves the children with the activities of the police but the impact of drivers speeding. They are not able to support the VAS signs as they don't have the technical resources needed. This will be raised with Inspector Hanley(?).

There was also a discussion of the role of the Traffic Police Officer which covers Community Speed Watch which encompasses speed limits, zebra crossings, speed limits approval, weight limits, bus stops and speed humps positioning. There are 746 speed locations but only six officers to cover them. The result is that the effectiveness of these speed limits is not managed. The key of course is to make the applicable speed limits noticeable and visible (speed humps). This can be improved by detecting those that speed and reinforce through education supplemented with Community Speed Watch.
